YEAR 7 NEWS

WELCOME TO TERM FOUR! Students have a new timetable for Term Four and it can be viewed on Compass and the Year Seven notice board. If your young person would like a printed copy, please get them to contact their Pastoral teacher.

Students continue with the same Arts subjects as Term Three and will be able to consolidate their skills as a result. Music will include both theory and practical components and students will play and produce music. In Art, students will use the design process to create and evaluate artwork. They will learn about the elements and principals of art and explore different art mediums. Students will begin a new STEAM project this term and have started the design folio in the first week of term. They will design, create, and evaluate a clock. In English, students are writing poetry and will

submit a collection of poems for their Common Assessment Task at the end of the term. Fractions and Probability are the two topics of study in Maths for the term. Students will explore how fractions represent parts of a whole and conduct experiments to grasp the concepts of chance and likelihood. In Science, students will learn about Space and Renewable Energies. They will investigate the seasons and the difference between day and night. Indonesian classes will involve the study Indonesian animals. You are encouraged to discuss the amazing biodiversity in Indonesia with your young person. In Health, Year Seven students will explore the extremely relevant topic of risk taking behaviours and create their own toolbox of strategies to use when faced with challenges. Business and Economics in Humanities will allow students to explore the rights and responsibilities of consumers.

To make the most of all learning opportunities provided in Term Four, students are expected to have all equipment including their laptops at each class. Please check in with your child and ensure that they have the equipment required to be successful in classes.

Each Tuesday, after school sessions will be running in the Open Learning Centre from 3:15pm to 4:15pm. These sessions provide an opportunity for students to catch up on outstanding Common Assessment Tasks (CATs) from Term Three. If you receive a text message, this means that your young person has at least one CAT they need to complete. If you would like to discuss your young person's CAT completion in more detail, please contact the College on 5144 3711.

A reminder that Year Seven Connection Day will take place on Tuesday of each week. Students need to bring a packed lunch and wear comfortable casual clothes that are suitable for physical activity. This term, students will attend classes at the beginning of the day before participating in local excursions. Every second week, we will require you to provide consent for your young person to attend via Compass. If consent is not provided prior to the day, your person will not be able to attend. If you would prefer hard copy permission forms, please contact the front office and we will send them home with your young person.

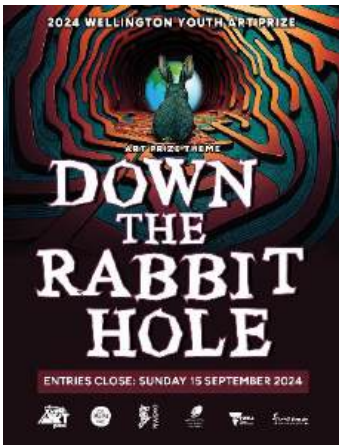

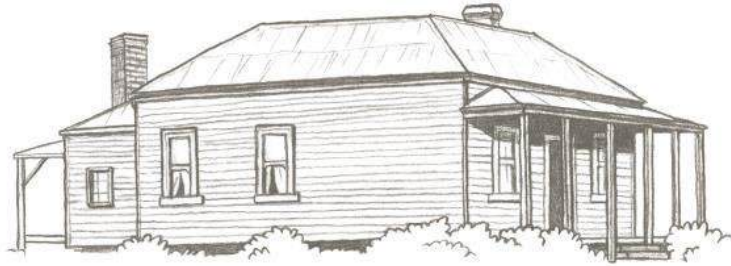
