Students Soar in Virtual Reality: A Flight Experience Like No Other!

Students have recently taken to the skies—virtually—through an exciting and immersive aviation experience that combined theory and hands-on learning. This engaging session introduced them to the principles of helicopter flight, using cutting-edge technology to bring STEM concepts to life.

During the lesson, students explored the key forces of flight—lift, thrust, drag, and gravity—and learned about the mechanics behind how helicopters manoeuvre. With the latest VR goggles featuring 360-degree video footage, they were able to visualize complex aerodynamics in a way that made learning interactive and engaging.

But the real highlight? Taking control in the Virtual Reality Helicopter Simulators! Four state-of-the-art simulators provided students with a realistic flying experience, allowing them to test their skills and get a feel for what it's like to pilot a helicopter in flight.

This unique experience not only sparked curiosity but also showcased the exciting STEM career pathways in aviation, aerospace engineering, and technology. With the thrill of flight still fresh in their minds, students walked away inspired and eager to learn more about the world of aviation! Thanks to Major David McEvoy and the Team from Army Defence Force for providing this amazing opportunity.

Stephen Edwards also has proved us with an update into his Marine Science class:

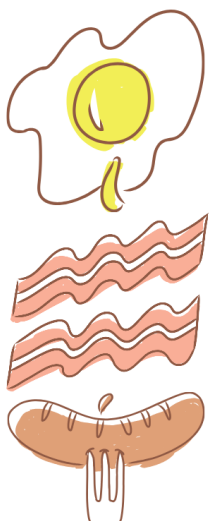

YEAR 10 CAMP

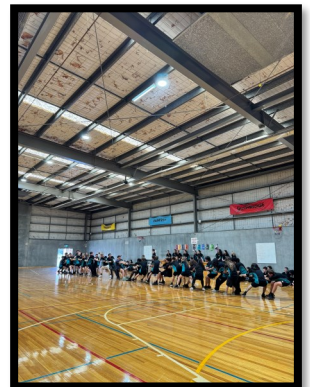
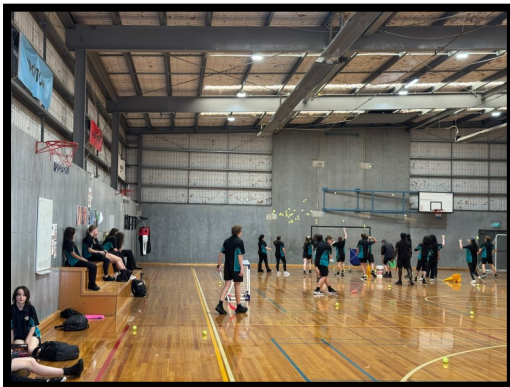

STUDYING SMARTER

Studying smarter can be learned. These habits include approaching study with the right attitude, choosing the right environment, minimizing distractions, setting a realistic schedule, and employing memory games, among others.

There are lots of things competing for your attention, it's hard to concentrate on studying. And yet, you have to do some studying in order to progress and consolidate your knowledge. The key to effective studying isn't cramming or studying longer, but studying smarter.

Some people enjoy reviewing their materials with a group of friends or classmates. Such groups work best when they're kept small (4 or 5 others), with people of similar academic aptitude, and with people taking the same class. Different formats work for different groups. When and where will my order be delivered? The bulk order will be delivered to one address chosen by the group order manager. Deliveries are not made to individual addresses. Delivery is approximately 10 weeks from when the order manager submits the group order. Production on garments will not begin until that order submission.

What size should I order? Reform offers adult unisex sizing, which is different from conventional sizing. Please refer to the sizing chart on our website - it is important to ensure the instructions are followed carefully as we don't offer refunds/exchanges if the incorrect size is ordered.

Do I need to create an account to order? Yes, you will need to create an account so you can manage your order until the group deadline. An order confirmation and payment receipt will be sent to the email address used to create the account. Please ensure you keep this until after you have received the item. How do I pay? Payments are made via credit/debit card on checkout.

Can I make changes to my order? You can edit your order before the group deadline by logging into your account and clicking "orders" at the top of the page. Select the order you wish to make changes to, make the relevant changes, and save. If you have already ordered, you can click "edit" in your order confirmation - this takes you back into the order. Make your changes and save. Changes cannot be made after the group deadline.

When do I have to order by? The group deadline set by your order manager will appear at the top of the ordering page. You have until 11:59pm AEST of the group deadline date to place your order. We cannot accept orders once the deadline date has passed and the order is closed.

My name is too long - can I still have it on my garment? Please email us with the following details: order ID/organisation name, which design to order, and the size and the name spelled exactly as you want it (case sensitive). We will confirm what's possible.

What characters are supported in the custom name field? Our custom names can support any character found on a standard keyboard. All custom names are case sensitive and we cannot support emojis or symbols. Can I cancel my order? Please contact us for any cancellations – they cannot be processed after the group deadline.

I've missed the deadline - how can I place an order? Please speak to your order manager about a deadline extension or opening an additional order (minimum order quantities and surcharges may apply). We cannot accept orders once the deadline date has passed and the order is closed.

YEAR 12 WORK RELATED SKILLS STUDENTS have hit the ground running, starting the term by analyzing characteristics of a healthy, collaborative, cooperative and harmonious workplace. After exploring the meaning of these characteristics, student applied their knowledge during a LEGO building challenge. This activity simulated the workplace in that students had to negotiate roles, communicate clear objectives, and include all team members in the process. Following the completion of this activity, students reflected on the process and shared strategies and ideas with their peers on how they can positively contribute to a workplace environment.

YEAR 11 LITERACY STUDENTS have started their new unit of work - 'Getting your L's' – designed to increase student confidence around all things driving. Throughout this unit students will explore a range of text types, including videos, information texts, websites and podcasts. They will also participate in practical hands-on activities such as how to undertake basic car maintenance, a Road to Zero and L2P incursion, and an excursion to apply their learning to our local roads. The unit will culminate with a research project and podcast where students argue whether the driving age in Victoria should be lowered.

For students who are new to the instrumental program at Sale College, here are a few reminders about instrumental lessons and ensemble rehearsals.

- Once you have returned your enrolment form, you will be able to start instrumental lessons.
- Your lessons will be up on Compass, and it is very important that you check Compass regularly to make sure you know when your lesson is.
- Once a week, you will have an instrumental lesson for 30 minutes. The lesson times will rotate as best as possible to make sure you do not miss the same subject every week.
- Once ensemble, or band, rehearsals start it is a requirement that you attend. Your instrumental teacher will tell you which ensemble/s you will be a part of.

For our continuing students:

- Once you have returned your re-enrolment for, you will be able to start instrumental lessons.
- Please make sure you check Compass regularly and make sure you let your instrumental teacher know if you are unable to attend your lesson.

For any students who have chosen not to continue in the instrumental program, you must return your school instrument as soon as possible. If you do not return it, the Music team will be in touch with parents/guardians about missing school equipment.

If students or parents/guardians have any questions about the instrumental music program or instrumental lessons, please contact the school and ask to talk to a member of the Music team.

STUDENT LAPTOP CLAIMS

LAPTOP CLAIM REMINDER

Each student is entitled to one laptop insurance claim per school year, covering accidental damage only. Loss, theft, or deliberate damage are not covered.

A \$100 excess is required for each valid claim, payable to Sale College.

Any incidents not covered (such as loss, theft, or deliberate damage) or claims made by students who have already used their annual claim will be subject to repair costs, which will be provided based on a quote.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

DESCRIPTION OF UNIFORM

- College Zip Up Jacket.
- Plain black pants
- Black summer shorts (with or without college logo) of approved style and material
- School polo shirt with Logo
- A plain black long sleeve may be worn beneath the shirt
- Dress of approved style and material.

- Black enclosed shoes or runners (leather or vinyl)
- Bucket Hat with Logo

Points to note

- Scuffs, thongs, sandals and raised heels are not acceptable for health and safety reasons. School approved footwear should always be worn. For practical subjects safety dictates that students must wear an enclosed shoe and may be excluded if not compliant.
- The VCE jacket is an acceptable alternative top for Year 12 students. There is a restriction on the colours allowed and the final design is approved by the Principal.
- Music uniform – students who are members of the Sale College Bands are permitted to wear the band uniform during performances.
- **Specifically excluded (not approved):** Cargo style pants or shorts, Corduroy pants/shorts of all types, Ballet flats, black skirts and hoodies.



All school uniform should meet the 'Sale College Dress Code' - this will be addressed on an individual basis

DOCTORS IN SECONDARY SCHOOLS

THE DOCTORS ARE BACK!

Sale College is fortunate enough to have doctors and nurses from Inglis Medical Centre returning to participate in the Doctors in Secondary School program for 2025. Starting from February the 5th, every Wednesday the doctors will be residing at the Macalister campus in the wellbeing area in the morning and then at the Guthridge campus in the portable building behind the gym from 2pm.

This program is intended to provide better access to primary care for secondary school students. The GP provides students with the same services as the kind normally provided by GPs in the community, including seeing students about their physical and mental health, and sexual and reproductive health issues. GPs may also make referrals to other health services as required. The GP will bulk bill consultations through Medicare, so there will be no out-of-pocket expenses for this service for your family.

This program is not designed to replace any existing medical arrangements your family may have in place but rather provide a convenient alternative to primary care within school hours, and encourage health care access to those students without an existing relationship with a GP. CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE

THE CONVEYANCE ALLOWANCE is a contribution towards transport costs and is not intended to cover the full cost of transporting children to and from school.

The conveyance allowance may be available to students attending government or non-government schools and:

- travelling by public transport or by private car, motorbike, bicycle or bus, and whose nearest school is not serviced by a free school bus provided under the School Bus Program

Eligibility criteria

- Reside 4.8km or more from the school
 - Be of school age and reside in Victoria
 - Be enrolled in a school for 3 or more days per week
 - School/campus is located outside the metropolitan conveyance allowance boundary
- Student is attending their nearest appropriate school/campus

Our students and families are important partners in this process. We welcome your feedback or ideas on ways we can improve our approach to child safety and wellbeing.

PRIVACY COLLECTION NOTICE

The Department of Education and Training (the Department) values your privacy and is committed to protecting the personal and health information that schools collect.

All school staff must comply with Victorian privacy law and the Schools' Privacy Policy. This notice explains how the Department, including Victorian government schools (schools), handles personal and health information. On occasion, specific consent will be sought for the collection and use of information, for example, for a student to receive a health service. Our schools are also required by legislation, such as the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*, to collect some of this information.

Throughout this notice, 'staff' includes principals, teachers, student support service officers, youth workers, social workers, nurses and any other allied health practitioners, and all other employees, contractors, volunteers and service providers of the school and the Department.

On enrolment, and during the ordinary course of a student's attendance at a school, schools will collect information about students and their families for the following purposes:

- educating students
- supporting students' social and emotional wellbeing, and health
- fulfilling legal obligations, including duty of care, anti-discrimination law and occupational health and safety law
- communicating and engaging with parents
- student administration
- school management
- supporting policy in relation to student education and wellbeing.

If this information is not collected, schools may be unable to provide optimal education or support to students or fulfil legal obligations.

For example, our schools rely on parents to provide **health information** about any medical condition or disability that their child has, medication their child may take while at school, any known allergies and contact details of their child's doctor. If parents do not provide all relevant health information, this may put their child's health at risk.

Our schools also require current, relevant information about all **parents and carers** so that schools can take account of safety concerns that affect their children. Parents should provide schools with copies of all current parenting plans and court orders about or that affect their children and provide updated copies when they change.

When parents enrol their child in primary school, they will be asked to provide personal and health information in several ways, including via the Enrolment Form, the School Entrance Health Questionnaire (SEHQ) and the Early Childhood Intervention Service (ECIS) Transition Form.

The **Enrolment Form** is used to collect information that is essential for the purposes listed above, and requests information such as:

- **Emergency contacts** – Individuals parents nominate for a school to contact during an emergency. Parents should ensure that their nominated emergency contact agrees to their contact details being provided to the school and that they understand their details may be disclosed by the Department if lawful, e.g. in the case of emergency communications relating to bush fires or floods.
- **Student background information** – Information about country of birth, Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander origin, language spoken at home and parent occupation. This information enables the Department to allocate appropriate resources to schools. The Department also uses this information to plan for future

educational needs in Victoria and shares some information with the Commonwealth government to monitor, plan and allocate resources. • **Immunisation status** – This assists schools to manage health risks and legal obligations. The Department may also provide this information to the Department of Health and Department of Families, Fairness and Housing to assess immunisation rates in Victoria, but not in a way which identifies students.

• **Visa status** – This is required to process a student's enrolment.

All schools may use departmental systems and online tools such as apps and other software to effectively collect and manage information about students and families for the purposes listed above.

When schools use these online tools, they take steps to ensure that student information is secure. If parents or carers have any concerns about the use of these online tools, please contact the school.

School staff will only share student and family information with other school staff who need to know to enable them to educate or support the student as described above. Information will only be shared outside the school (and outside the Department) as required or authorised by law, including where sharing is required to meet duty of care, anti-discrimination, occupational health and safety, and child wellbeing and safety obligations. The information collected will not be disclosed beyond the school and Department without parent consent unless such disclosure is lawful.

When a student transfers to another school (including Catholic, independent and interstate), personal and/or health information about that student may be transferred to the next school. Transferring this information is in the best interests of the student and assists the next school to provide the best possible education and support to the student. For further detail about how and what level of information is provided to the next school, refer to the: [Enrolment: Student transfers between schools](#)

Schools only provide school reports and ordinary school communications to students, parents, carers or others who have a legal right to that information. Requests for access to other student information or by others must be made by lodging a Freedom of Information (FOI) application.

To update student or family information, parents should contact their school.
